Foreigners' health centre and dental care charges at the Kainuu Social and Health Care Joint Authority

Urgent treatment

Urgent treatment is provided irrespective of nationality if the severity of the illness so requires (unpredictable illness).

Fees charged:

EU/EEA countries or Switzerland, Australia, Quebec: The patient has a European Health Insurance Card or an E111, E112, E121 or S1 form. For citizens of the Nordic Countries and the United Kingdom, a passport, sickness insurance card or ID card is sufficient. **Charges are the same as for Finnish citizens.**

Patients will be charged the actual cost if they do not have the forms listed above or if they come from a country without a reciprocal social security agreement (countries other than those listed above).

Non-urgent treatment

Non-urgent treatment is given on the basis of a doctor's assessment of the need for treatment. Non-urgent treatment refers to chronic illnesses and clinic services.

EU/EEA countries or Switzerland, Australia, Quebec: Border workers resident in Finland, employees posted to Finland and accompanying non-working family members, seafarers and accompanying non-working family members, and students are among those who may be entitled to non-urgent treatment. The patient charges will be the same as for Finnish citizens provided that the customer can demonstrate his or her entitlement to treatment benefits.

Countries without a reciprocal social security agreement: Fees are charged on the basis of actual costs.

A person residing in Finland permanently is entitled to the full range of health centre services.

Fees for health centre treatment or dental care charged at actual cost (patient without a European Health Insurance Card, form or certificate):

- under 18 years of age, visit to doctor's surgery €240,70
- under 18 years of age, visit to nurse's/public health nurse's clinic €55,20



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- over 18 years of age, visit to doctor's surgery, patient charge €20,60 + standard municipal charge €226,70 for the first three visits, in total €247,30 and €240,70 for subsequent visits
- over 18 years of age, visit to nurse's/public health nurse's clinic, patient charge €20,60 + standard municipal charge €52,00 for the first three visits, in total €72,60 and €55,20 for subsequent visits
- visit to dental care, patient charge (dental hygienist €10,20, dentist €13,10, specialized dentist €19,20) + standard municipal charge €132,00, total €142,20 – 151,20 €/visit
- visit during doctor's emergency duty (emergency duty fee on day before public holidays) over 18 years old €20,60/visit + standard municipal charge €226,70, total €247,30
- visit during doctor's emergency duty (weekends, days before public holidays falling on a weekend and public holidays that fall in the working week) over 18 years old €28,30/visit + standard municipal fee €226,70, total €255,00
- telephone contact by a nurse / public health nurse €15,30
- telephone contact by a doctor €26,30
